Safety Tips



Unfortunately no neighbourhood is completely resistant to crime. However, these steps can help you to keep your family and your neighbourhood safe:

- Know where your children are. Have your children tell you or ask permission before leaving the house. Give them a time to be back at home. If possible, have them leave a phone number of where they will be.
- Help children learn important phone numbers. Help your children to practice reciting their home phone number and address, as well as your work and cell phone numbers. If they have trouble memorizing these, write them down on a card and have them carry it at all times. Tell your children where you will be and the best way to reach you.
- Set limits to where your children may go in your neighbourhood. Do you want them to cross busy roads or playing in alleys or abandoned buildings? Are there certain homes in your neighbourhood that you do not want your children to go to?
- Get to know your children's friends. Meet their parents before letting your children go to their home. Keep a list of their phone numbers. If you cannot meet their parents, call and talk to them. Ask what your children might do at their house and if they will be supervised.
- Choose a safe house in your neighbourhood. The best is to pick a neighbour's house where to your children can go if they need help if you are not around. Point out other places they can go for help, for example stores, libraries and police stations.
- Teach children to settle arguments with words, not fists. Role-play a problem to teach them necessary arguments. It is important that children know that they can walk away from fist fights and they should know what to do when confronted with bullies. Remind them that taunting and teasing can hurt friends and make enemies.
- Work together with your neighbours. Watch out for suspicious and unusual behaviour in your neighbourhood. Get to know your neighbours and their children, so you can look out for one another
