★ Safety Tip ★

What is suspicious?

Anything that seems even slightly "out of place" or is occurring at an unusual time of day or night could be criminal activity. The following are some obvious things to watch for:

A stranger entering your neighbor's house when it is unoccupied;

A scream heard anywhere might mean robbery or assault;

Offers of merchandise at ridiculously low prices may mean stolen property;

Anyone removing accessories, license plates, or gas from a vehicle should be reported;

Anyone peering into parked vehicles may be looking for a vehicle to steal or for valuables left in the vehicle;

Persons entering or leaving a place of business after hours;

A sound of breaking glass or loud explosive noises could mean an accident, burglary or vandalism;

Persons loitering around schools, parks and secluded areas could be sex offenders;

Persons loitering in the neighborhood who do not live there; and

Anyone forcing entry to, or tampering with a residence, business, or vehicle should be reported.

Know Your Patrollers: Eckhardt & Georine Rechholtz

Eckhardt and Georine Rechholtz moved to Pioneerspark 34 years ago on the 1st of August 1983. By that time they were married for about one year. They bought their first home in Von Bodenhausen street where they are still residing today. Eckhardt started to patrol on-and-off in December 2014 and by the end of 2015 he was patrolling as a permanent patroller. Georine only recently started to patrol and has completed her 30 shifts, whereas Eckhardt did over 70 shifts already. Georine is also responsible for updating the patroller's OB's. The OB is the "Occurrence (register) Book for the patroller shift's on and off bookings.

As a retired couple they enjoy doing patrols together. "We do patrol with other patrollers individually as well but patrolling together give us more time to chat and we just enjoy it! Its like an outing! Laugh.."

Eckhardt and Georine thinks a Neighbourhood Watch is a very good initiative in every community: "You get to know your neighbours and your streets. As a patroller you build friendships that are very important. Bonding friendships in your community are a necessity for spreading awareness and safety tips. That way the community can look out for each other. Extra advantages are that community- and patroller families can join in projects together. PPNHW is a Neighbourhood Watch that goes from strength to strength where the community members assist the patrollers by being our eyes and ears."

Eckhardt: "You learn and grow as a person if you do patrolling. I will never forget one night when my co-patroller and me were at a house where there was house drama which nearly ended up being traumatic. It's a good feeling to be part and to be of assistance."

Georine: "In my short time as a patroller, one incident was very funny to me... We passed a house and there was a woman on the pavement under the influence of alcohol, holding on to the fence. She was standing in a spread out position, thinking that she was hiding. By that time the whole street's dogs were upset. After the authorities were called out to the scene and arrived, the woman was taken away for her own safety. But what happened then...? More than one tow-in vehicle also arrived on their own.. "

TIPS TO BE SAFE

Walking alone especially at night, could pose a risk for physical harm or robbery. Yet no matter how you try to avoid it, it's almost inevitable you'll have to walk by yourself at some point – from a friend's house, perhaps to the corner store or an evening walk or jog.

KEEP SAFE WHILE ON YOUR WALK



Walk with a purpose and avoid distraction. When walking alone make sure to look ahead. Mobile phones are handy for entertainment but they are also a big source of distraction especially if you are texting, on social media or listening to music on your headphones. They take your attention away and you are less aware of your surroundings.



Wear reflective clothing and comfortable shoes. Reflective clothing enables cars to see you as you walk at night.



Vary your route. Do not take the same route all the time just in case someone is monitoring your movements.



Walk with a friend. When walking at night, always try to bring a friend or a dog along with you. There is safety in numbers, and you are less likely to be approached if you are with someone.



Notify someone. If you have to walk alone at night, let someone know that you will be walking alone. Make sure to tell them your plans, travel routes, and arrival time.



Avoid dark areas. Restrict your routes to well-lit areas, and always carry a flashlight in case you encounter a dark patch. Do not be tempted to take a shortcut through a dark alleyway or parking lot.
