Security Advisory

Please note that we are receiving reports of an increase in crime levels in Windhoek at the moment.

This is to be expected.

- Reduce the opportunity for the commission of crime. Items of value should not be displayed. If possible, arrange with someone you trust to check on your house intermittently and to put lights on for the evenings, creating the impression that someone is at home. Ensure that your dustbins are not left outside in the road after they have been cleared.

- Test your alarm system and ensure that it is activated and functioning properly. Ideally, your alarm system should be linked to a security company offering armed response.

- Do not leave any items in your vehicle. Smash and grab incidents are on the rise.

- If you do not take your firearms with you on holiday, please ensure that they are properly secured. Police and some gun shops are prepared to securely store weapons.

- Remain vigilant and report any suspicious persons or vehicles on this group. Situational awareness is critical.

- Please ensure that you display a PPNHW sign. This will assist our patrol teams on duty. Contact Odette directly to purchase a sign.

- Finally, do not fear crime, just take the necessary precautions and be prepared.

Know Your Patrollers: Richard & Janine Grant

Richard & Janine Grant are both patrollers and also responsible for updating the monthly crime statistics for PPNHW.

Richard: "We are part of the few that started to patrol in the beginning. Back then we were only about 20 patrollers. Without a shift schedule, we patrolled with no specific times, which so often left gaps between shifts. We just patrolled... Pioneerspark was also not divided into shift zones yet."

Richard and Janine are residents of Mostert Street for 10 years now. Richard, a born Namibian, met Janine while studying in Johannesburg and brought her with him to Namibia. Their 10th wedding anniversary will be celebrated in February 2018. Janine is working in the Banking Section while Richard enjoys his printing, framing, etc. line of business.

For extramural activities, Richard is quite busy with his Freshwater Bass Fishing competitions. He is part of the Namibian team for 7 years now and serves as chairman for the NBAA. Janine is currently busy with her Grade 5 practical musical level in keyboard while doing her Grade 3 theory through Unisa at the same time.

During their first patrol they came across an armed robbery with 4 men at a house with only female residents. "Not knowing what to expect and being on our first patrol, we handled it realy good. We parked in the driveway and phoned Nampol Serious Crime Division. They responded within a few minutes to assist us and the criminals fled the scene."

Janine: "The funniest incident was where an old man, heavy under the influence, stopped at a service station. He nearly ran over one of the attendants, got out of and then back into his very old Land Rover again and started reversing out of the service station, over the road and into the river were the vehicle was halted by a tree!" "A Neighbourhood Watch is not only for safety......you also become part of a family and get to know the community. PPNHW is there for the family that stays behind when the men are on the road."

TIPS TO BE SAFE

Being a responsible driver is not just about the ability to control a car and having good reflexes but about attitude and being able to spot and understand dangers on the road. Your safety is your responsibility, therefore take extra caution and be vigilant when driving.

STAY SAFE ON THE ROAD



Plan your journey well in advance and allow yourself time to take short breaks when driving long distances to avoid driver fatigue.

Obey the speed limit and maintain at least a three second following distance. This distance should be increased at night, in foggy or rainy conditions and when the road is wet.



If a breakdown occurs, never get out of a vehicle to make a repair on a busy road. Turn hazard lights on and get the vehicle to a safe place before getting out.
