#### Know Your Patrollers: Claus & Kornelia Jendrissek

Know your patrollers: Claus & Kornelia Jendrissek
Claus & Kornelia were both born in Germany. Kornelia
was raised in Germany but Claus moved to Cape Town
with his family at age 2. They met each other in
Switzerland and got married in Windhoek in 1997.
They stayed in Olympia previously, but moved to
Pioneerspark in 2005 and became house owners in
Prinsloo Street.

"We were feeding a neighbour's dog during a Dec/Jan holiday and while parked in front of their gate with the headlights on, patrollers stopped and asked if there was a problem. We were so impressed, we got the contact details and joined as members in February 2015. Not long after that we started patrolling". Claus and Kornelia completed 238 and 191 patrol shifts respectively.

Claus is a surveyor at a company, but when time allows, he can be found in his hobby room building ship- and train models. Kornelia does social work for the Lutheran Church. She visits the senior citizens at hospitals, old age homes and at home. She also organises coffee meetings and trips for them and handles all the administration going with it. Kornelia likes to calls herself a "Lady of all trades." During her free time she likes to do sewing, cooking, reading and to socialize.

"With our shifts so far, we only experienced the ordinary daily incidents like a triggered alarm, a flat tyre or a lost dog". Claus helped as spotter for the baboon that came into Potgieter Street a while ago until Nature Reservation arrived.



#### Illegal Dumping Remains A Problem

Illegal garden refuse dumping remains a problem in Pioneerspark and with the good rain comes even more garden waste. Not only is dumping of waste on pavement and riverbeds illegal but it also invite others to do the same and it attract rodents and snakes to the area.

We would therefore like to remind all residents that this is illegal and hereby request that:

- Residents report any illegal dumping of waste to either PPNHW or directly to City Of Windhoek via fax, telephone or in person if possible with proof);
- You will be requested to provide the correct details of the location of the dumping and any information related to the incient and the person(s) dumping the waste;
- City Officials will then investigate the illegal dumping incident to ensure that the culprits take responsibility for the dumped waste;
- Where the culprit is known, they will be requested to remove the waste within a specific period;
- Where no culprits can be traced, the illegally dumped waste shall be removed by the City.

A smash-and-grab incident plays on the elements of speed and surprise. The opportunists usually smash through the car window on the passenger side while the car is stationary at traffic lights or stuck in slow moving traffic causing a few moments of silent paralysis for the motorists – which gives them just enough time to grab something of value like a jacket, handbag or a laptop before they flee the scene.

#### Ten tips to avoid being a smash and grab victim

- · Don't have bags, cellular phones, briefcases or other valuables visible inside the vehicle – valuables only attract thieves who may break your car window.
- · Lock all your doors and close the windows when driving.
- · Never open vehicle windows or doors for strangers.
- · Avoid opening your windows or getting involved in discussions with street vendors or anyone handing out
- · Be constantly on the lookout for suspicious activity and trust your instinct.
- · Always be conscious of your surroundings and remain alerted when coming to an intersection or stopping your vehicle.
- Be wary of people standing at intersections they may be innocent but perpetrators mix with these people while waiting for an opportunity to pounce.
- · If you encounter obstacles such as rocks or tyres do not get out of your vehicle to remove them. Reverse and drive off in the opposite direction.
- · If it's late at night, slow down well in advance so that the light changes green by the time you reach the intersection.
- · Leave a gap between you and the car in front of you to give you room to escape if anything should happen.

#### SAFFTY IN THE HOME



Test your alarm system every six months and have your security company test the battery and back up battery annually.



Ensure you have security bars and gates installed – it is the most common home security measure.



Add some security lighting. Adding lights with sensors at strategic points on your property is a good crime deterrent. In particular, focus on areas around entrances such as your garage and front door.



Do some strategic gardening. If you have a small jungle growing around your property that intruders could

easily hide in, use as a climbing aid, or that obscures your view when pulling out onto the road, now is a good time to do some trimming. Particularly look at the front of your property at the main entrance.



Save important contact numbers in case of an emergency. Make sure you familiarise your family with an action plan, should an incident occur.



Get a fire blanket and extinguisher.
As many household fires start in the kitchen, these are important tools for extinguishing a fire before it gets out of control. Fire extinguishers should be serviced once a year to ensure they are in working order.
