2 New Cameras in Coetzee street, close to Jordan at T-Junction (Engen)

Know your patroller: Terry Cooper



Terry Cooper was born in Durban but moved to then Rhodesia and Nyasaland soon after. He moved through 3 countries in his first 6 years and completed schooling with advanced levels. He then did Chartered Institute of Secretaries via night school.

Terry moved to Namibia in 1980 where he has been involved in the accounting and information technology field, within various business genres throughout his working life. He started as a junior clerk in the tobacco industry. He was acting as the Group Accountant, IT manager and then FD as final position.

"I started cycling at the age of 50, only because some youngsters at work made a bet with me and I have enjoyed it ever since".

"Terry moved to Pioneerspark in 2004 but only noticed a PPNHW board in the street much later and made the decision to join.

"The main reason for this was that I had been brought up to help wherever I can. I knew that a difference could be made, no matter how small.

What I mostly enjoy is the camaraderie between the patrollers and the effort the majority put in with every task they are given. Even if there are a few groans about the taskmaster".

Terry did his first patrol shift on the 25th of September 2015 and he has completed 300 patrol shifts up till June 2019. Terry is a dedicated patroller, being active as a day and night patroller. He also assists and participates in all the other PPNHW projects.
