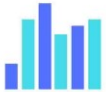

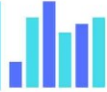

Know your patroller: Marco Koziol

Marco Koziol was born and raised in Windhoek. He started Grade 1 and completed grade 11 at DSW and DOSW respectively (Primary & Secondary). In 1992 he left for Cape Town to matriculate at the Boston House College and to do further studies.

"Then in 1996, my dad sent me to Germany (with a one-way ticket!!) to go and study for "a real practical career" I however decided to go for two instead... I did my apprenticeship as bricklayer and completed a steel & concrete study as well". Marco returned to Namibia in 2001 to join his father's company. Currently he is in the earth moving, civil engineering and construction business with his partners.

"My connection with Pioneerspark is very strong and of a long-term history. I grew up here since 1979. Till 1994, the Koziol family stayed in Van der Merwe Street. In 2007 I bought my own house in Henckert Street and I'm still here..."

Marco did his first patrol shift on the 23rd of February 2015 and completed 271 patrol shifts to date.

His decision to get involved was to contribute in the safety of his family and friends. "Shifts are not always just serious & crime related, I've experienced hilarious & time consuming shifts as well. I did a shift with our 'German Engelsmann' where we attended to a residential call out in Jordan Street. While observing the yard with our torches, I suddenly heard a splash. It was my partner on the pool cover but the cover did not hold him on top... We were sure that any intruder would not return to Pioneerspark after the loud outburst that followed..."

One night I was alone on an undercover shift when I spotted a vehicle that couldn't keep in one lane. I've followed him on to Hendrik Witbooi Road, where he damaged the first 2 tyres against the pavement. He proceeded to Mandume Road, where he stopped near the bridge, opened the door and fell out. He stayed there till the Traffic Officials arrived. After that I had to go in and made a statement, so I only got home at 02h00 in the morning.

The Koziol family likes to travel and to camp out in the wild. "It's good to get out of the city once in a while to unwind and relax from the daily routine."

TIPS TO BE SAFE

There are certain things which we all know we should do, but somehow between trips to the shops, transporting kids and important things on TV, we never quite get around to doing them. Take just one Saturday morning to make some changes that may help you sleep more soundly at night.

SAFETY IN THE HOME



Test your alarm system every six months and have your security company test the battery and back up battery annually.



Ensure you have security bars and gates installed – it is the most common home security measure.



Add some security lighting. Adding lights with sensors at strategic points on your property is a good crime deterrent. In particular, focus on areas around entrances such as your garage and front door.



Do some strategic gardening. If you have a small jungle growing around your property that intruders could

easily hide in, use as a climbing aid, or that obscures your view when pulling out onto the road, now is a good time to do some trimming. Particularly look at the front of your property at the main entrance.



Save important contact numbers in case of an emergency. Make sure you familiarise your family with an action plan, should an incident occur.



Get a fire blanket and extinguisher. As many household fires start in the kitchen, these are important tools for extinguishing a fire before it gets out of control. Fire extinguishers should be serviced once a year to ensure they are in working order.

Ticking off even just a few of the risk checks we've just explored will help you sleep more soundly tonight. And remember, when risks do become a reality, all the solutions you need are only a call away.
